K. Report of the Superintendent

Student scheduling for the next school year is currently underway at the high school and rising 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students are in the process of selecting their courses. Notifications regarding student placements in these grades, as well as information about waivers will be mailed home in mid-May. I know a lot of folks are anxiously awaiting that and we will be releasing that information in a couple of weeks.

Our administration, teachers and students are gearing up for the upcoming state standardized testing (everybody's favorite time of year) including AP exams, which are scheduled to take place next month. We extend our best wishes to our students for success and have every confidence that they will perform admirably.

Aside from that, you always like, prior to the state testing beginning, to really sort of, and I know our schools are doing this, encourage parents the same, to really take this on. We are a competitive township. We are a competitive community. We like to excel. We like to be on top, so really going into this testing recognizing that, yeah, certainly, it is about students demonstrating what they know and what they have mastered but we know that, as a community, to some extent, we are evaluated by virtue of the way that we perform on these tests. So, just in terms of really focusing during that time, getting proper rest, getting proper nutrition prior to coming in and then just giving your best shot, so, I know our students will give it their all and I'm looking forward to seeing how they fare.

On the topic of testing and, by extension, rankings, U.S. News and World Report recently released its high school rankings. Holmdel High School has moved up 10 spots in New Jersey rankings, from 64 to 54. It is worth noting that out of the 53 schools ranked ahead of Holmdel, 22 are county vocational, magnet or charter schools, which leaves 32 traditional public high schools ahead of us in these rankings. One of the key factors contributing to this ranking is the college readiness index.

Now, for comparison, Glen Ridge High School ranked as the top traditional public high school in the state with an overall ranking of 11, has a college readiness index of 84.9. Holmdel High School, in comparison, has a college readiness index of 53.8. A critical criterion for this index is the percentage of students taking at least one AP course, as well as dual enrollment opportunities. As previously presented, one of our district goals this year was to increase student AP enrollment by 10% and I am in the process of gathering that data as we look to take stock of how we fared. Additionally, we have significantly expanded our dual enrollment

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offerings for the upcoming academic year and we remain optimistic that positively impacting these two indicators will have a significant effect on our college readiness index and consequently, our rankings.

However, it is essential to offer some perspective. While rankings primarily rely on test scores, they do not measure the day-to-day rigor of the curriculum and instruction offered in a school. When we examine the percentage completion rate of Holmdel High School graduates from college or a university within four years, it stands at 85%, nearly three times the national average. One could argue that that is as good a college readiness index as any is our completion rate after four years. Nonetheless, we obviously understand that improving rankings is an aspiration of our community and a source of pride and so we will continue to focus on enhancing them while maintaining overall culture, climate and well-being of our students because that is an important thing to consider. As we chase rankings, how does that impact the overall nature of our school environment? How does that impact on student mental health, in creating a hyper-competitive academic environment? I would argue, and it is ok if you disagree, that the environment that we have at Holmdel High School right now, is actually very good because there is a balance. Students who are hyper-academically focused have an environment where there are opportunities for them and they can chase that as far as they want but it's not over the top where we have kids who are making themselves sick over grades and I think that is something to celebrate as much as the rankings. We always want to be moderate and balanced, in the way that we go about chasing these rankings. Certainly, it is a metric worth following to see if we can move the needle.

As a side note, U.S. News & World Report also publishes a list of the best New Jersey middle schools and, out of the 1385 middle schools, our very own middle school, W.R. Satz, ranks at number 38, so not too shabby there as well.

So, once again, we celebrate our successes and acknowledge our upward momentum. I do believe this progress, is obviously not only a result of the hard work within our school community, of our staff and our students and our parents, but I would argue that it is also the starting to see dividends of the thoughtful, deliberate and strategic setting of goals in alignment with district protocols, procedures and policies. I think that, as our five-year strategic plan continues to unfold and comes to fruition, I do believe that through that, the results and the gains will come because of those strategic connections.

Finally, I would like to remind all parents and guardians to check my community letters for the link to the strategic plan survey. This survey is being conducted, and it's the same survey that was administered last year to inform the setting of the plan, now it is being administered on a yearly basis for us to be able to track our progress against key benchmarks. I am going to bother you tomorrow at home via robo-call, so you will hear my voice, about the strategic action plan survey, so tell your friends and organizations to please fill this survey out. We are really looking for as many people to weigh in, and give us input, as possible so we appreciate that in advance and that is my report, which I respectfully submit into the record.

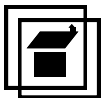
## P3125.2 EMPLOYMENT OF SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS

The Board of Education will employ substitutes in order to ensure continuity in the instructional program and will approve a list of substitutes on an annual basis and additional approved substitutes will be added to the approved list throughout the school year. Substitute teachers will be employed from the substitute list recommended by the Superintendent and approved by the Board. The Board shall also approve the substitute rate of pay.

All substitute teachers must possess a substitute credential issued by the New Jersey State Board of Examiners in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-7.1 et seq. All substitute teachers are required to undergo a criminal history record check in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:6-7.1 et seq. and New Jersey Department of Education regulations and procedures for criminal history record checks. In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:6-7.1b., a substitute teacher who is rehired annually by the Board shall only be required to undergo a criminal history record check as required by N.J.S.A. 18A:6-7.1 et seq. upon initial employment, provided the substitute continues in the employ of at least one of the districts at which the substitute was employed within one year of the approval of the criminal history record check.

A substitute teacher shall follow the daily lesson plan provided by the regular teacher and, when that plan is exhausted or unavailable, the instructions of the Principal. A substitute teacher may not plan or direct an instructional program except as expressly permitted by the Superintendent.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:16-1.1b. and N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-7.4(c), a vacant teaching position may only be filled by one or more individuals employed as substitute teachers and holding an instructional certificate of eligibility (CE), certificate of eligibility with advanced standing (CEAS), or standard certificate issued by the New Jersey State Board of Examiners with an endorsement within the scope of the subject being taught for no more than sixty instructional days in the same classroom per year. The sixty day limit may be extended if the Executive County Superintendent is notified of an extension by the school district which shall demonstrate:





## EMPLOYMENT OF SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS

1. The school district was unable to hire an appropriately certified teacher for the vacant position;
2. The school district is filling the position subject to the limitations in a local contract or N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-7.1; and
3. Holders of an instructional CE or CEAS with an endorsement within the scope of the subject being taught meet the following provisions:
  - a. CE or CEAS holders obtain a provisional certificate;
  - b. CE or CEAS holders are enrolled in a district mentoring program upon obtaining a provisional certificate;
  - c. CE holders are accepted into a CE educator program and will begin coursework in the program's next available cohort.
4. Parents/Guardians with a child and/or relative who is enrolled in the school district may not serve as a substitute teacher in the school at which their children or relative attends.
  - a. In the elementary schools, the above language applies only to the grade level in which the related student is enrolled.
  - b. For purposes of this provision, relatives shall be defined as siblings, nieces, nephews, or any person living in the same household.

In the event that one individual employed pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:16-1.1b. is employed in the same position for more than sixty days, the substitute shall be compensated by the school district on a pro-rata basis consistent with the salary provided to a teacher with similar credentials in the school district.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:16-1.1c. and N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-7.4(b), a vacant teaching position may only be filled by one or more individuals employed as substitute teachers and holding an instructional CE, or a CEAS, or a standard certificate issued by the New Jersey State Board of Examiners with an endorsement not within the scope of the subject being taught for no more than

forty instructional days in the same classroom per year. The Executive County Superintendent of Schools shall be notified by the Superintendent or designee if a holder of an instructional CE or CEAS substitutes for more than twenty instructional days in the same classroom.

Holders of a career and technical education substitute credential pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-7.5 shall be permitted to substitute for no more than forty instructional days in the same classroom per year in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-7.4(b)2.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:16-1.1a. and N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-7.4(a), a vacant teaching position may only be filled by one or more individuals holding a substitute credential or holding an administrative or educational services certificate without an instructional CE, CEAS, or standard certificate issued by the New Jersey State Board of Education pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:6-38 for no more than twenty instructional days in the same classroom per year. The Commissioner of Education may grant an extension of up to an additional twenty school days upon written application from the school district demonstrating the district's inability to hire an appropriately certified teacher for the vacant position within the original twenty-day time limit.
